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


#### From the Principal's Desk




















































## Public Speaking


#### **Stage 3 – 56R Planting Trees**




#### **Kindergarten and Preschool Gardens.**


#### **MEETING UPDATE**



#### Jarjums and Bunjis

We can't believe it is the last term for our children to be at Preschool. It has been a busy few weeks with our excursion to Sydney Zoo and then Book Week.

The children LOVED going to the zoo as a group and it was lovely to spend the day with them all as well as the families that came along. There was a real sense of community as we explored the zoo together, watching the animals and talking about their behaviour. We followed up on this learning over the next couple of weeks, focusing on the animals the children particularly liked through stories, art and small world play.

In Week 2, the children were part of our whole school Book Parade. The children enjoyed dressing up and walking around Area 1 with families watching. We also had many visitors to the Preschool during the week to read stories to the children. We'd like to thank Mrs Jurisic (SLSO), Mrs Konarew (EALD Team), Mrs Ritchie (AP), Mrs Alba (LST) and Mrs French (AEO) for coming to see us to share their favourite stories and love of literacy. It was also very special to spend time with Uncle Wes in the library listening to him sharing stories about Australian animals.

At the moment we are learning about space. The children have been exposed to new words and concepts such as gravity and atmosphere. We have done a science experiment to explore gravity and watched YouTube videos of real astronauts on the International Space Station to see how the absence of gravity makes people and objects float. We have also created balloon rockets which have taught the children about speed, force, action and reaction.

Together we are excitedly getting ready for Kindergarten! We are visiting classrooms and talking a lot about what big school will be like. We are looking forward to celebrating our preschool journey in coming weeks.

## Stage 3






This term we have also started elective classes, where all Stage 3 students were able to choose 3 different classes to participate in, classes range from Cooking to PE to Visual Arts and much more.




































## 34G
