
Work is underway with Area 1 to improve the lighting and sound system.

Kindy have been developing their love of reading by visiting the school library. They have been learning how to choose books, take care of them and return them on time. They have even designed their own library bags in Art.



































### PURPOSEFUL PATTERNS























We even found patterns in our arrays when we looked at multiplication and area, using grid paper. PATTERNS are everywhere!

















## \*\* ZOOSNOOZ






### ST MARY'S ZONE ATHLETICS CARNIVAL
